BHT Learning Links is a programme to support insecurely housed people into learning and/or work.

First Base Catering Training Project: Project providing catering training for homeless/ex homeless people and internal and external placement service. Learning Links: Training for homeless/ex homeless people to move onto qualifications in literacy and numeracy and then to work placements. Service User Consultancy: Service User involvement across BHT service users; training for service users and work placement service.

A project providing pre-employment training and a minimum two-week unpaid, supported work placement for individuals with a homeless background. Benefits to clients are to increase confidence, gain work-place experience and a current reference with a well-known local employer. Post placement support to assist clients take constructive steps towards gaining sustainable employment or maintaining their employment is a major part of our programme.

Neighbourhood Renewal Brighton & Hove



Employment and training is one of Neighbourhood Renewal's key themes due to the inequality of employment and training opportunities across the city. Residents of Neighbourhood Renewal areas are over three times more likely to be on benefits than those from other areas of Brighton & Hove. Those who are employed are far more likely to be in low paid work. In the long term, low incomes have far reaching implications for individuals and families across all areas of their lives. Specifically targeting services from a wide range of service providers working together, will work towards reducing the levels of inequality of opportunity across the city.





Equal Brighton and Hove is a city-wide initiative that supports adults into training and employment. We do this by providing European Social Funding to a variety of projects undertaken by local organisations. The projects work with people who have experienced difficulty in accessing conventional routes to learning and work. Our aim is to enhance the employability of disadvantaged local people and provide a skilled labour pool for employers.
