About The Enham Kilimanjaro Challenge



Enham, the charity which provides opportunities for disabled people, is organising an **expedition for 9 disabled and 9 non-disabled people** to climb and descend Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania from the 5th to the 16th July 2008.

The aim of the project, with the assistance of a broadcast professional film crew, a prestigious TV and Movie score composer and editor and our TV coverage, is to raise awareness of Enham and its work empowering disabled and disadvantaged people, and to raise funds.

A Unique Challenge

Understood to be the **first multi-ability** UK team to climb Kilimanjaro, the project will present a unique challenge to demonstrate the benefits of diversity within a team.

It will focus on a buddy system which will enable each team to help each other to face common challenges, to achieve a common objective, to realise their own potential, to help others to realise theirs, to make their own choices and to be in control of their own personal development.

The Enham Kilimanjaro Challenge will develop awareness of the challenges which disabled people face in all aspects of their lives and support a commitment to inclusion and diversity which is central to everyday life and business in the 21st Century.

Why Kilimanjaro?

Crowned by eternal snows, the mighty Kilimanjaro is the highest free-standing mountain in the world and dominates its landscape unlike any other mountain. Kilimanjaro also perfectly highlights nature's battle with its own challenges presented by a rapidly changing climate.

Located in Tanzania, this extinct volcano looms over five eco-systems and large game reserves and is certainly one of the world's most impressive sites.

The ascent up this great peak is non-technical by nature. However, it affords a full mountaineering experience, with all the rigours and rewards, for those in strong physical condition.

It is generally considered that to climb Kilimanjaro is one of the most challenging, rewarding and treasured experiences in the world to the non-technical climber. It is also a most fantastic adventure that can be experienced by everyone regardless of their individual ability.

The expedition logistics will be undertaken by Alpine Ascents International, a highly experienced Trekking company with a strong background of arranging and leading climbs on Mt. Kilimanjaro. Steven Ballantyne is the Expedition Project Manager. He has travelled extensively and for the past two years has been undertaking expeditions for clients such as the Scientific Exploration Society.

The route has been selected as being the most interesting wilderness experience offering all-round enjoyment and beauty for the climbers and as the most achievable for a group of mixed ability.




In Partnership with You

The Film - action

As part of the expedition, a specially commissioned film is being produced. The documentary will follow the personal stories of the participants and of each team. This will be accompanied by an inspiring score, written by Michael Price whilst he actually participates in the climb.

This will be a film of the triumph of human spirit in the face of diverse challenges, set against the backdrop of the plight of a changing Earth.

We will incorporate footage of Diversity and DDA programmes within participating organizations.

This version of the programme will then be made available for corporate PR and training purposes within all of our partner businesses. A version of the film will also be distributed via mainstream television on channels such as BBC, Meridian, CNBC, Sky and National Geographic.

Selected pod casts and radio interviews featuring the individual or buddy pair champions' participant(s) will also be distributed via local television – Meridian and BBC and via the host website of Enham. Enham have already agreed three features on Meridian TV and our "champions" may be able to gain valuable exposure from an early stage.

Logistics Project Manager – Steven Ballantyne

Steven started his career as a Dance Movement Therapist working primarily with young adults with profound Autism and a range of physical disabilities; he was a founder member of the East London and City Bereavement Association and ran his own successful private counseling practice until 2001 when he chose to make a career move into the world of expeditions.

Since that time Steven has traveled extensively to some of the worlds remotest developing countries in the world including Iran Jaya (now west Papua) and East Timor, he has lived with the Tengegerese community at the foot of Mount Bromo in East Java and was taken captive in Papua New Guinea, but following a dramatic Air rescue has since returned many times to lead independent expeditions across the Kakoda Trail and Black Cat Trail.

Steven has recently founded the Expedition Project Management Ltd, developing and running expeditions with a purpose for charities and corporations as well as undertaking reconnaissance trips into some of the remotest parts of the worlds for TV and film companies and organisations who require this service prior to planning future projects.
